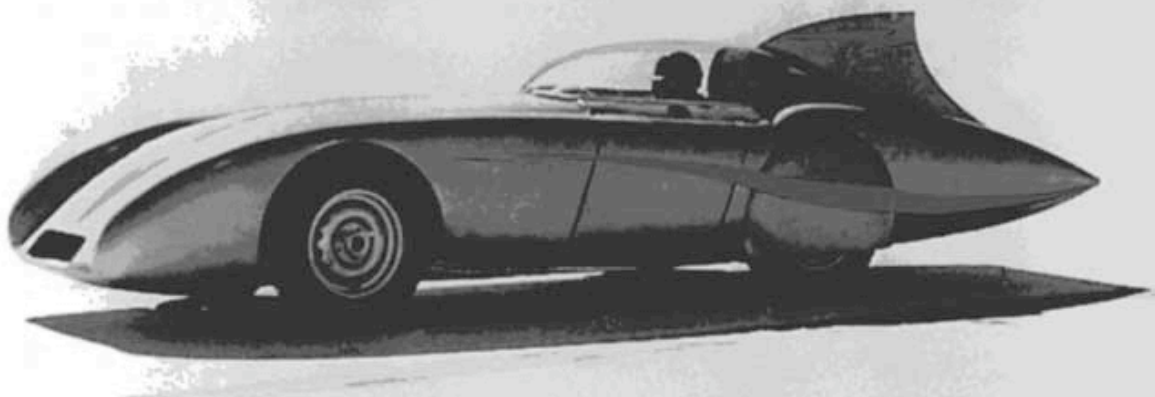

1) Collect your first card and Head north on Portland International Raceway toward N Broadacre Rd

2) Turn right at first opportunity on N Broadacre Rd

3) Turn right at N Expo Rd

4) Turn Left at Stop

5) Straight at light. Turn left at N Hayden Meadows Dr.

6) Turn left at N Union Ct

7) Continue straight at stop and N. Union Ct becomes N Marine Drive

8) Turn left at NW Frontage Rd

*Name 5 Fast Food Restaurants on Frontage Road.*

***McDonalds, Taco Bell, Arbys, Popeyes, Subway***

9) Turn right at NW Graham Rd ( 16.6 miles)

10) First left at Historic Columbia River Hwy.

a) Stop at the Troutdale General Store "289 E Columbia Gorge Hwy" on your left.

Collect your 3rd Card!

11) Upon leaving town look for the train depot and pull in to station.

a) *Find Troutdale's Elevation.*     **56 Feet**

b) *When was it built and rebuilt?* **1882 & 1907**

c) *It's name is a palindrome.*     **Otto**

d) *What can you get at Jacks \_\_\_\_\_ & \_\_\_\_\_?*     **Snack & Tackle**

e) *What is the weight Limit on Bridge?* **30 Tons**

f) *A Classic Mini Weights about 1500lbs. How many minis can be on the bridge at one time?*     **40**

12) Bear right after bridge to stay on Columbia River Highway (\*see appendix)

a) *What does Tad's serve?* **Chicken & Dumplings**

b) *Who is playing tonight at the Tippy Canoe?*     **Gary Savage**

13) Turn right at SE Stark St (Right onto the Bridge) towards Oxbow Regional Park  
(20.1 miles)     (\*see appendix)

*What must pedestrians do?*     **Use Walkway**

As you cross the Stark Street Bridge built in 1914 you will see the site of the original Portland Auto Club House. It is currently the private residence of Sauce King Junki Yoshida.

14) Pull over to the right 0.2mi past Kerslake Road.

*What year did the Columbia River highway open?*     **1915**

15) Turn right at SE Troutdale Road (22 miles)

16) Turn left at SE Cherry Park Road Towards Troutdale Post office (23.1 miles)

17) Turn right at NE 257th Dr (23.6 miles)

18) Turn left at Columbia River Highway

19) Turn left at SW Halsey Street into McMenamins Edgefield (25 miles)

a) Take your 2<sup>nd</sup> right through the parking lot

*What was the original name and function of this property?*

***Multnomah County Poor Farm***

b) Exit right past Ruby's Spa

c) Left on Halsey Street

20) Turn right at NE 238th Dr (25.7 miles)

21) Turn left at T (NE Sandy Blvd/US-30)

22) Turn right at NE 223rd Ave (26.7 miles)

23) Turn left onto Portland Marine Drive west bound (27.7 miles)

24) Turn left at NE 122nd Ave

25) Turn right at NE Airport Way

26) Turn right to merge onto I-205 N toward Seattle (33.3 miles) (\*see appendix)

27) Take exit 27 to merge onto WA-14 East toward Camas (35.8 miles)

28) Take exit 8 for SE 164th Ave (37.7 miles)

29) Turn right at SE 164th Ave

30) Turn right at SE Evergreen Hwy (Caution: Rough Road)

31) Turn left at State St (43.4 miles)

32) Turn right at T onto SE Riverside Dr

33) Left at first opportunity. (SE Riverside Dr turns left and becomes SE Shorewood Dr)

34) At the T, turn left at E Evergreen Blvd (44.1 miles) (Speed bump on both sides of bridge)

35) Turn left at Grand Blvd

*In 1824 The Hudson Bay Company chose this site as the first location of Fort*

36) Turn right at E 5th St to enter Fort Vancouver National Site

37) Turn left into Pearson Air Museum. (46.3 miles)

38) Continue thru parking lot and turn left at Stop Sign.

39) Turn left at E 5th Street

40) Turn left into Fort Parking lot or park on street to avoid the gravel! (46.7 miles)

*What year were the two large cannons made? **1804***

*True or False: Historic Ft. Vancouver was a military fort? **False***

PICK UP CARD #4 from at Entrance of the Historic Fort.

41) Return westbound on E 5th Street

- 42) Turn right at Ft. Vancouver Way
- 43) At roundabout, take the 1st right onto E Evergreen Blvd
- 44) Turn left at E Reserve St to leave Fort Vancouver National Site (47.9 miles)
- 45) Turn Left at E Mill Plain Blvd

- 46) Merge onto I-5 South via ramp on Left towards Portland (\*see appendix)
- 47) Take EXIT 306 toward INTERSTATE AVE./PTLD. INT'L. RACEWAY.
- 48) Take the ramp toward DELTA PARK/PTLD. MEADOWS.
- 49) Straight at Stop.
- 50) Left at First Opportunity.
- 51) Left at First Opportunity.
- 52) Pick up Card #5 from Start/Finish line.

### **Appendix:**

#### **HISTORIC COLUMBIA RIVER HIGHWAY• SANDY RIVER BRIDGE AT TROUTDALE**

Constructed in 1912, the Sandy River Bridge at Troutdale is the oldest structure on the Historic Columbia River Highway. Designed by the premier bridge engineering firm of Waddell and Herrington, which also created the 1912 Steel Bridge, a through double-deck vertical lift truss of telescoping design, and the 1910 Hawthorne Bridge, a through vertical lift truss, both over the Willamette River in Portland. The Sandy River Bridge at Troutdale is one of two beginning points of the Historic Columbia River Highway. The other is the Stark Street Bridge. Multnomah County built it as part of a large farm-to-market road improvement campaign of the 1910s. The bridge initially served nearby rural residents from the rolling fields high above the Columbia River east of Troutdale. Just east of the bridge.

#### **HISTORIC COLUMBIA RIVER HIGHWAY• STARK STREET BRIDGE**

This bridge replaced an old wooden Pratt through truss. The old bridge had collapsed, coincidentally on Good Roads Day, April 25, 1914, dropping a five-ton truck into the river. It had served as part of the county's extensive rural road system. This river crossing was at the east end of Base Line Road, Which dated from 1854 when 30 people petitioned for a road to be built

from the Sandy River to Portland. This area of the Sandy River near Base Line Road was popular with the Portland Automobile Club, and between 1912 and 1913 the organization constructed a frame and stone building west of the bridge for picnics and other club activities. Sometime in the 20th century Base Line Road became an extension of Stark Street and so took on this name.

**The Glenn L. Jackson Memorial Bridge, or I-205 bridge.**

Planning for the structure began in earnest in 1964 when it was designated as part of the East Portland Freeway (later renamed Veteran's Memorial Freeway), Interstate 205. Construction began in August 1977. In order to avoid disrupting river traffic, the bridge was built one segment at a time. The segments, weighing upwards of 200 tons, were cast four miles (6 km) downstream and barged into place. The bridge was opened on December 15, 1982. The final cost of \$175 million was shared by the states of Washington and Oregon. Three men died during its construction.

It is a twin structure with four lanes in each direction and a bicycle and pedestrian path in between. The bridge was named for Glenn Jackson, the chairman of the Oregon State Highway Commission and later the Oregon Economic Development Commission. As of 2004 the average daily traffic was 137,000 vehicles.

**The Interstate Bridge , or I-5 bridge.**

The Interstate Bridge is a pair of nearly identical steel vertical lift, through truss bridges that carry Interstate 5 traffic over the Columbia River first opened to traffic in 1917 with a second span opening in 1958, the bridge handles 124,500 vehicles (as of 2004).

The bridge was built to replace an overcrowded ferry system operated by Pacific Railway, Light & Power Co. Construction on the bridge began in March 1915, following the sale of bonds. The first bridge was opened on February 14, 1917 at a cost of \$1.75 million, which was shared between Clark County and Multnomah County. It was the first automobile bridge across the river between Washington and Oregon, and the second to span the river at all, after the Wenatchee Bridge of 1908. It was originally a toll bridge costing 5¢ per person. In 1929 the states of Washington and Oregon jointly purchased it from the counties and subsequently removed the tolls.

In 1958 a \$14.5 million upgrade created a southbound span and doubled the capacity of the bridge. At the time the new bridge was opened, the old one closed to give it the matching humpback. When both bridges were opened in 1960, tolls were reinstated at \$.20 for cars, \$.40 for light trucks, and \$.60 for heavy trucks and buses, until removed in 1966 after the construction expenses were paid off.
